SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

- 5. <u>WOMAN'S SAILING SEMINAR will be SEPTEMBER 26-8</u> and Blue Water captains will help teach that.




PROBATION DEPARTMENTS SAILS:

<u>ALAMEDA COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION:</u> The Sweeney class will begin on September 5, six classes and graduation over the next three months. Mentor Mentee method. El DORADO PROBATION: The adult probation sail was delayed...stay tuned for new date.

ALAMEDA JUVENILE HALL PROGRAM: Recall we were approached by Juvenile Hall personnel to try a new program with fully incarcerated students...something never attempted before in California. We had our first of two test sails on August 6, and our second sail is September 13. If these work, will become part of a regular program for our best mentors and sailors and graduating students will go on to fire camp or Camp Sweeney. After these first sails courses on mentoring these students will be given by the probation personnel at Juvenile Hall.





Training & Certification:

The quickest way to move up the certification ladder...and a lot of fun.

1. First Aid and CPR —Our next class is August 30 and the following class will be 10/4 or 10/25. REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. FREE FOR VOLUNTEERS.

- 2. Certification sail on Bear with live overboard drill is September 13.
- 3. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> Day certification with live MOB 8/30 (late start due to CPR class, begins at 1130!) and a night overboard practice on 10/3. (Only sign up for the night practice if you have already done day live overboard drill)
- 4. ALETA to be scheduled soon...check our calendar.
- 5. RECALL THAT CALIFORNIA LAW NOW REQUIRES ALL PERSONS TAKING OTHERS SAILING TO HAVE THE CALIFORNIA BOATER'S CARD AND THAT IS REQUIRED FOR OUR CERTIFICATION...IT'S ALL ONLINE, EASY TO GET, CHEAP, AND DOES REVIEW FOR YOU MUCH USEFUL INFORMATION. GET IT! REQUIRED FOR ALL FIRST AND SECOND CAPTAINS.
- 6. And note that if you come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list. You do not necessarily have to do the certification sails to get certified...but they move things more quickly.

7. For those involved in mentorship with probation students, the officers at Juvenile Hall will be giving mentorship training in October or November...stay tuned.

GOLDEN BEAR: Baby stay hydraulics back on, bosun Colm now checking out coffee grinder which is making odd sounds.

ALETA: Rigging repair completed, possible small engine leak, should be back in water and ready to sail by third week in August.
