SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

SF

The sails but will begin in October. On Golden Bear from San Francisco. MARIN:

We are starting sails with both Middle Schools and High Schools coming all the way from Pt. Reyes and Tomales beginning in September, on Golden Bear. Captain Les will put those sails on calendar in the near future. Our first venture with a Marin school district.

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing, and we have many new exciting programs:

- 3. <u>WOMAN'S SAILING SEMINAR will be SEPTEMBER 26-8</u> and Blue Water captains will help teach that.



PROBATION DEPARTMENTS SAILS:

<u>ALAMEDA COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION:</u> The Sweeney class now begins its third session this week, new Probation Officer taking over from retired Mr. Young. Going well. Mentor Mentee method. September 26 is our next class, making model sail boats and going out to see how real ones work.

El DORADO PROBATION: The adult probation sail was delayed...stay tuned for new date.

ALAMEDA JUVENILE HALL PROGRAM: Recall we were approached by Juvenile Hall personnel to try a new program with fully incarcerated students...something never attempted before in California. The first experimental sail went very well and our second is set for October 4. After that sail, we have a meeting in San Francisco with the leaders at both Sweeney and Juvenile Hall to discuss how to make this into a regular program, the first of its kind. That meeting is set for October 17.





Training & Certification:

The quickest way to move up the certification ladder...and a lot of fun.

- 1. First Aid and CPR Our next class is 10/18. REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. FREE FOR VOLUNTEERS.
- 2. Golden Bear: just concluded a live MOB drill. Stay tuned for the next.
- 3. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> A night overboard practice on 10/3. (Only sign up for the night practice if you have already done day live overboard drill)
- 4. ALETA to be scheduled soon...check our calendar.
- 5. RECALL THAT CALIFORNIA LAW NOW REQUIRES ALL PERSONS TAKING OTHERS SAILING TO HAVE THE CALIFORNIA BOATER'S CARD AND THAT IS REQUIRED FOR OUR CAPTAIN CERTIFICATION...IT'S ALL ONLINE, EASY TO GET, CHEAP, AND DOES REVIEW FOR YOU MUCH USEFUL INFORMATION. GET IT! REQUIRED FOR ALL FIRST AND SECOND CAPTAINS.
- 6. And note that if you come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list. You do not necessarily have to do the certification sails to get certified...but they move things more quickly.
- 7. For those involved in mentorship with probation students, the officers at Juvenile Hall will be giving mentorship training in November...stay tuned.
