SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

SF

No sails in December due to holidays and storms but beginning in January to the end of the year sails are signed up for the District schools, every Thursday until summer, on Golden Bear

leaving from San Francisco. The sails are now once a week, all on Golden Bear from San Francisco, every Middle and High School...our oldest program, now over thirty years old.

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing, and we have many new exciting programs:

- 1. <u>PORT AUTHORITY SUMMER PROGRAM</u>. These sails concluded with very happy participants, and they wish us to set up sails for next year. Now calendared.
- 2. MAKANI BOATING CLUB. Makani is a coed junior boating club for ages 11-13 affiliated with SF Sea Scouts. Golden Bear, two outings, 11-1300 and 1330 to 1530. February 21. And a second sail on April 4.

PROBATION DEPARTMENT SAILS:

- 1.Our newest program combines juvenile hall students with Camp Sweeney students, both male and female.
- 2. Kimberly has set up the sails for the girls with women only crews and she has scheduled additional "all lady" sails for January 10, 2/1 (night), 2/6, 2/13, 2/21 with graduation with both the boys' and girls' program on 2/22. On Golden Bear and Aleta.
- 3. Meanwhile, the boy's program is progressing with sails on 1/3, 1/24 (night), 2/7, 2/14 and graduation on 2/22. Mentor mentee method. The graduation will be a major effort with potluck, families and friends attending...and you?
- 4.Our goal is to use *Aleta* more with these students and we need to certify more crew and captains. There are certification sails on Aleta being scheduled and we urge all volunteers to get up to speed on Aleta...about half the sails will use Aleta if we have sufficient certified people for it.
- 5. We wish to have the probation officers become certified crew and a sail dedicated only to the Pos and their training will soon be scheduled. They are already practicing actively on board with the students and are enjoying it greatly. Stay tuned.

We are still exploring working with other probation departments, such as Marin.





CERTIFICATION:

- 1. First Aid and CPR Next class on February 21, 10-12 at Berkeley Yacht Club. Most of it is done online before the class. REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. FREE FOR VOLUNTEERS.
- 2. Certification sail on <u>Bear</u> with live overboard to be scheduled soon, check our calendar.
- 3. Benjamin Walters live overboard drill is set for February 28.
- 4. ALETA had a certification sail set for December 13.
- 5. RECALL THAT CALIFORNIA LAW NOW REQUIRES ALL PERSONS TAKING OTHERS SAILING TO HAVE THE CALIFORNIA BOATER'S CARD AND THAT IS REQUIRED FOR OUR

6.CERTIFICATION...IT'S ALL ONLINE, EASY TO GET, CHEAP, AND DOES REVIEW FOR YOU MUCH USEFUL INFORMATION. GET IT! REQUIRED FOR ALL FIRST AND SECOND CAPTAINS.

- 7. And note that if you come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list. You do not necessarily have to do the certification sails to get certified...but they move things more quickly.
- 8. Recall that the certification process is a checklist of accomplishments signed off by a first or second captain and one progresses to certified crew, second captain and, at times, first captain. Every sail with students requires a first captain, a second captain, and three certified crew. It is thus vital that all volunteers seek to move up the certification ladder.
- 9. Our First Aid trainer is now offering not just CPR and First Aid but is newly certified as a wilderness first aid trainer and will be offering that far more extensive course (two days) in the next few months. *Think of signing on...*
- 10. We need more volunteers willing to jump overboard for the live drills... *Many have moved away...* And Aaron has agreed to do so, using Lee's drysuit... that should allow us to double the MOB drills.

BOSUN'S REPORT:

GOLDEN BEAR: New jib bag; Bosuns checking out oil leak in engine.

ALETA: Back in water from yard, ready to go, Bosuns Scott and Aaron checking her weekly.

BENJAMIN WALTERS: Engine maintenance done, more gear for students. All at owner expense.

DEVINE WIND: She needs a new Blue Water flag which will be delivered to Captain Andy.
