SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

We sail with every middle and high school in the SF District system...Next sails on newly repaired Golden Bear...1/18;1/25;2/8;2/15;2/22;2/29. Different school each time but each a public school in the SF District. Police are likely to be assigned to the sails again in Spring.

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing, and we have many new exciting programs:

1. Hanna Center, a residential program for traumatized children, has asked us to set up a regularly scheduled series of sails and those will be calendared when school begins again after the holidays.

- 2. Epilepsy Foundation has scheduled their next sail for February 3 on Benjamin Walters. Remember, Type 1 life are to be on each participant since they may be unconscious in the water.
- 3. Blind Sailors. Recall we are working with blind sailors now and they have participated in many of our sails acting as co-mentors of students. They are interested in a racing team being put together by Captain Andy and in participating in our regular programs, such as the probation sails. We are beginning to also work with Lighthouse for the Blind. Expect regular sails to be set up in Spring.
- 4. Project Rebound is a departure from our usual population... these are formerly incarcerated adults connected with SF State and these sails will be a bonding experience for them as they integrate into a college setting. Our first sail went well. They are completing their paperwork and they are likely to
- 5.be trained as mentors to the students over the next few months...and will be regular volunteers of Blue Water. Check the events page.
- 6. *PACT sails*. We began a new program with PACT and we have two double sails with Aleta and Benjamin Walters on May 4 and again on May 11.
- 7. Greenagers will be coming back for more sails, the first on March 9.
- 8. Larkin Street Youth Center, a transitional housing program, had a sail on October 10 and will be planning more. .
- 9. RAMS sails. This is a community group from the Richmond District offering comprehensive services for at need populations, specializing in Pacific Islander, Asian and Russian communities. They already had a sail on September 30, and we will be scheduling more.
- 10. International Rescue Project. Their sail on September 29 went very well...more to be scheduled soon once weather improves.
- 11. Marin City. Les is reaching out to them to set up more sails.



PROBATION DEPARTMENT SAILS:

ALAMEDA COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION NEXT CLASS BEGINS:

Our next series of classes with Alameda County Probation will begin on 2/2 and have a mix of returning students and new students. Our classes will include both Aleta and Benjamin Walters, sometime sailing in tandem, and we will also schedule a VIP sail on Gaslight with judges and administrators later in the year. The Classes are 2/2;2/16;3/1 (Aleta); 3/15;3/29;4/12 (night sail);4/26 graduation. Captain Scott is now designing an advanced class for Sweeney graduates that will be considered by the Board over the next few months. Josue', our Sweeney scholarship graduate with a BS in nursing now, will come to the first sail to discuss possibilities with the Sweeney students. EI DORADO PROBATION: Captain Lee will be checking on their current status.



Training & Certification:

The quickest way to move up the certification ladder...and a lot of fun.

1. First Aid and CPR —Our next class will be on JANUARY 27, 2024, BERKELEY YACHT CLUB. FREE TO VOLUNTEERS, MUCH OF IT ONLINE, AND REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. SIGN UP ON OUR WEBSITE EVENTS PAGE.

- 2. Certification sail on Bear February 4.
- 3. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> has <u>night</u> overboard live practice on February 16...don't sign up if you have not already done a day practice.
- 4. ALETA certification sail on June 8.
- 5. And recall if come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list.

Recall that **Sategna Foundation**, our longtime partner, working with Jim Stanton and Lee, sent a Hanna Center student to the music festival in a village in Tuscany this last summer. Captain Jim is now searching for the next

student to go to Italy for a culture change that can change the life of the student. Kimberly has some connections (including a member of the jazz band playing at our February 3 party) and over the next few months we will begin the selection process for the next student.

Also recall that **Sategna Foundation** has agreed to fund an additional Sweeney or other equivalent student for vocational or college scholarships once our selection process is completed. Josue', our scholarship recipient, graduated Suma cum laud with a BS in nursing from USF, was the selected student speaker at his graduation, and has agreed to work with Blue Water and Sategna to help others follow his footsteps...straight As while working full time for a BS in nursing!! He comes to the Sweeney sail on February 2 to talk to the students and may join the advisory board of Sategna Foundation.
