SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

We sail with every middle and high school in the SF District system...Next sails 1/18;1/25;2/8. Bear is currently in the Yard so Benjamin Walters did the last sail, but Bear should be back in time for the 1/18 sail. Police are likely to be assigned to the sails again in Spring.

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing, and we have many new exciting programs:

1. *Hanna Center*, a residential program for traumatized children, has asked us to set up a regularly scheduled series of sails and those will be calendared when school begins again after the holidays.

- 2. *Epilepsy Foundation* has scheduled their next sail for February 3 on Benjamin Walters. Remember, Type 1 life are to be on each participant since they may be unconscious in the water.
- 3. Blind Sailors. Recall we are working with blind sailors now and they have participated in many of our sails acting as co-mentors of students. They are interested in a racing team being put together by Captain Andy and in participating in our regular programs, such as the probation sails. Captain Andy is hoping to set up spring sails with them for racing. Meanwhile, Mariette and several of our blind volunteers are working to integrate additional training for us working with blind people who are not already sailors working with some people from Lighthouse for the Blind. Expect regular sails to be set up in Spring. 4. Project Rebound is a departure from our usual population...these are formerly incarcerated adults connected with SF State and these sails will be a bonding experience for them as they integrate into a college setting. Our first sail went well. We will be doing these regularly from
- 5. APAAC sails. We are beginning a new program with the APACC (Asian Pacific Islander Committee, a community group for at need Asians and pacific islanders) and this relationship is likely to expand into regular classes similar to the probation sails. First sail was October 28 on Benjamin Walters. More coming...check the events page.
- 6. Aspire Schools. Kimberly is setting up sails with Aspire schools and this may become a regular monthly program...stay tuned.
- 7. Larkin Street Youth Center, a transitional housing program, had a sail on October 10.
- 8. RAMS sails. This is a community group from the Richmond District offering comprehensive services for at need populations, specializing in Pacific Islander, Asian and Russian communities. They had a sail on September 30, and we will be scheduling more.
- 9. International Rescue Project. Their sail on September 29 went very well...more to be scheduled soon.
- 10. Marin City. Les is reaching out to them to set up more sails.

Such people as Captain Jim and Kimberly are reaching out to even more community groups and that is one reason we have so many of these sails on the schedule. Check out which groups you would like to work with...!

1. First Aid and CPR —Our next class will be on JANUARY 27, 2024, BERKELEY YACHT CLUB. FREE TO VOLUNTEERS, MUCH OF IT ONLINE, AND REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. SIGN UP ON OUR WEBSITE EVENTS PAGE.

- 2. Certification sail on Bear end of January...check events page.
- 3. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> has <u>night</u> overboard live practice on <u>February 16</u>...don't sign up if you have not already done a day practice.
- 4. ALETA to be set up, as soon as mechanics check her engine out...stay tuned.
- 5. And recall if come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list.
