#### SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

We sail with every middle and high school in the SF District system...Next sails on newly repaired Golden Bear... 4/18;4/25;5/2;5/9;5/16 and for the rest of the year...dates on our website. Different school each time but each a public school in the SF District. Due to travel and work commitments, Captain Les is having problems fully staffing these sails (most on Thursdays) so if you can, join...parking is easy during weekdays at the Marina. Police are likely to be assigned to the sails again in late Spring.

#### **COMMUNITY SAILS:**

Community sails are continuing, and we have many new exciting programs:

1. Our program for visually impaired sailors will be working with Captain Andrew to begin the racing team, probably signing up for the South Beach Spring Friday night races which begin April 19.

2. *Epilepsy Foundation* has changed some of their management so delayed their next sail...but we expect new dates to be scheduled on Benjamin Walters. Remember, Type 1 life are to be on each participant since they may be unconscious in the water.

3. *Project Rebound*, formerly incarcerated adults connected with SF State and, soon, east Bay schools, are now active on the Sweeney sails, working on becoming certified. Some of the interns are also helping with the social media platforms of Blue Water. Turns out that many of our Sweeney students are attending state colleges with Project Rebound help. A great new connection.

4. *PACT sails*. We began a new program with PACT and we have two <u>double sails</u> with Aleta and Benjamin Walters on May 4 and again on May 11.

5. *Silver Springs* high school students come all the way from Grass Valley and have scheduled a sail for May 14.

6. *APACC (Asian Pacific Islanders American students)* have scheduled a sail for 5/18, Benjamin Walters.

7. *International Rescue Project.* Their sail on September 29 went very well...and they want their next sail on Bear on April 20.

8. *Marin City.* Les is reaching out to them to set up more sails.

9. *SF Casa* is now set for April 29. There will likely be sails every month for this great group. 10. *Larkin Street Youth* have their next sail on April 30.

11. *Marin City CDC* has met with Jim Stanton and Lee and will be arranging sails in the near future...and will attend the Sweeney graduation described below.

Alejandro, a Sweeney student from a decade ago, has returned as a volunteer for Blue Water and was on the night sail, telling the students what errors he made and how to get away from the life of the streets...he was a Project Rebound SF State student a decade ago and, as he said, blew it...but is now committed to giving back and guiding the students along paths he should have taken. The students were listening closely...and, as always, are great sailors. COME.

## **Training & Certification:**

The quickest way to move up the certification ladder...and a lot of fun.

**1.**<u>First Aid and CPR</u> –Our next class will be May 18 at BERKELEY YACHT CLUB.</u> FREE TO VOLUNTEERS, MUCH OF IT ONLINE, AND REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. SIGN UP ON OUR WEBSITE EVENTS PAGE.

2. Certification sail on <u>Bear</u> To be set up, check calendar on our website.

3. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> had a <u>night</u> overboard live practice on May 3...only open to those who have completed a day MOB and intend to go on our night sails.

4. ALETA certification sail with MOB practice on June 8.

5. And recall if come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list.

#### **BOSUN'S REPORT:**

**<u>GOLDEN BEAR:</u>** The grinder, repaired by Captain Colm and painted by Captain Marc, is now on board and working, to the delight of crew. The deck may need some more work near the rear hatch and will be caulked for now and it's time for a rigger to check the rig.

<u>ALETA</u>: In a storm certification sail the jib ripped and is now being repaired (at a cost of 800.00) but the flailing of the jib may have loosened the rigging so we are having a rigger come and check it right now. The packing gland remains an annoyance but one kept under control by Captain Scott.

**BENJAMIN WALTERS:** Whisker pole is now ready to mount, and this will be one of the skills we teach to our students. The new stable hard dinghy has arrived and is mounted on the davits, all at owner expense. A donor has delivered rain pants for children since we are taking younger and younger kids out...they are in a white box on the raft forward of Benjamin Walters.
