COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing and expanding:

- 1. Huckleberry Program Marin has student sails on Benjamin Walters on July 8, July 22 and one to be set up in August. Huckleberry SF will be setting up additional sails soon.
- 2. *Hanna Center*, a residential program for traumatized children have asked us to set up a regularly scheduled series of sails and those will be calendared soon.
- 3. Epilepsy Foundation will have their first sail with us on July 17 and August 5.
- 4. Recall we are working with blind sailors now and they have participated in several of our sails. They are planning to spend some additional hours on July 1 just learning Benjamin

Walters by moving over the boat and literally getting the feel of the gear. The racing team is continuing to train and hopes to have races begin on Divine Wind in the next two months. David Mischel, our safety officer, is working to develop certification guidelines for blind sailors and will be getting their input.

5. Greenagers sail will likely be in August.

6.Camp Keff sail now set for August 1.

7.SF Casa will be having a sail on June 24.

8.Our Marin City partner, Play Marin, has now set up sales on Golden Bear on 7/6;7/13;7/20;7/27 and 8/3.

9.Project Rebound is a departure from our usual population...these are formerly incarcerated adults at connected with SF State and this sail will be a bonding experience for them as they integrate into a college setting. August 12 on Golden Bear.

10. A tandem sail with our old friend Pegasus taking students from the City of Patterson Outdoor Experience, Aleta, 8/26.

11. Weekend Adventures (a group from the Tenderloin) will have their sail on Bear on 7/29.



PROBATION DEPARTMENT SAILS:

ALAMEDA COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION GRADUATION FOR OUR CLASS is July 14, with potluck on the dock, graduation certificates handed out, and a sail for their families. Our next class will have many of the same students so will be an advanced class where navigation, radar and other additional skills are taught. 1. <u>First Aid and CPR</u> —Our class at the Berkeley Yacht Club on JUNE 17, went well and the next one will be set up in perhaps three months. FREE TO VOLUNTEERS. As for whether it is time to renew your existing certification, Captain Les sends the following list and information:

As part of the certification for BWF volunteer sailors is the requirement to be current with FA/CPR/AED certification. Every few months we offer the class free of charge to volunteers.

Certifications are good for two years.

BOSUN'S REPORT:

GOLDEN BEAR: We still have to ponder the soft spot in the deck, ensure dock lines are in good condition.

<u>ALETA</u>: Once again we had the packing gland leak on a certification sail and staggered back to the dock…only this time at Berkeley Marine Center which has now put the first packing gland back in…and it is holding. Meanwhile, we are investigating a grant to put an electric engine in Aleta as part of an experiment and await the decision of the entity offering the grant. Thanks to Jennifer who has stepped up to be the "record keeper" and coordinator of the Aleta bosuns.

BENJAMIN WALTERS: Varnish work largely done, repair to dinghy almost completed, now working on thru deck fittings for boom brakes...all at owner expense.

MONEY: \$27,093 in the bank. The party, discussed below, will probably end up costing us about three thousand of it...key cost is insurance for the boats which is coming up. We do await the second half of the 100 Women Who Care grant this month.

INTERNSHIPS:

Internships give these students both experience and the beginning of a resume' that can open worlds for them. Jim Stanton is working with Matt Zarem to set up internships at Spaulding Wood Boat Center, dealing with students from Sweeney. This is life changing for the students, a key to a world outside the streets... **Know a business that would like an intern? Get onto the committee.**

SCHOLARSHIPS:

In terms of scholarships, **Sategna Foundation**, our longtime partner, working with Jim Stanton and Lee, is sending an ex Hanna Center student to the music festival in a village in Tuscany this summer. He has been selected after interviews and submitting musical samples. The founder owns a home in the village in Tuscany in which community is all. The concept for the future is to send the two students there for three weeks where they will live with the founder during the festival and be exposed to an entirely different world, one in which values, connection and culture is remarkably different. He will also teach local teenagers about the US music culture and would never have a chance for such an adventure absent this scholarship.

Also recall that Sategna Foundation has agreed to fund an additional Sweeney student once our selection process is completed. While welcome, given the ongoing needs of current recipients, we need additional sources of funding for our scholarships. Our last recipient, Josue', enters his last year for a BS in nursing this year. One of the Board members of Sategna was at our party and is committed to making this happen.
