SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

Our oldest program, taking every middle and high school in San Francisco District sailing, continues...all sails now booked through May. This program began in 1990...33 years ago! The holidays with school out normally have a month-long hiatus in sails...and then it is weekly until end of the school year.

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing and expanding:

- 1. Visually Impaired sails with Light House is moving along with special training requirements and gear still being planned and some of our blind volunteers regularly showing up on other sails. The racing team is still high on Captain Andrew's agenda.
- 2. *Epileptic Sails* are being scheduled, the next on December 16 with Type 1 Life vests being used to assure safety for the students.

- 3. Silver Springs High School, which comes all the way from Grass Valley, may be planning one more...will see.
- 4. *Project Rebound*, adults who are working to integrate back into society, had their first sail, and is setting up their college program to regularly volunteer with Blue Water in the coming year. Kimberly is working with them to make this happen in the next few months.
- 5. APACC has their next sail is being scheduled, the last one was a great success.
- 6. RAMS has their next sail being scheduled on Benjamin Walters.
- 7. International Rescue Project had a great sail on Bear and will be setting up another sail soon.
- 8. Larkin Street Youth Program also had a remarkable sail on Bear and will be setting up more soon. Kimberly will reach out to schedule.
- 9. Marin City will be contacted by Captain Les for scheduling after the holidays.
- 10. Music Schools being approached by Captain Jim for the scholarship to Italy have asked if we can also take some of their students sailing and we will be setting that up.



PROBATION DEPARTMENT SAILS:

ALAMEDA COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION YEAR CONTINUES A new class is about to begin, a formal graduation of the old class is on the calendar, and they are setting up a night sail (to see the lighted boat parade) the same day as their brunch December 15, to check out the lights in the City. All on our calendar page for you to join should you wish...The formal graduation ceremony for the last class is January 5...potluck and two boats going out.

A. Gaslight charters, with their big boat, will be doing one of the sails for the new class and it is planned various probation administrators will also attend.

<u>EI DORADO PROBATION:</u> Weather has delayed them coming down to SF but Chief Brian says some students are ready to come down again and will be scheduling them soon.

Training & Certification:

The quickest way to move up the certification ladder...and a lot of fun.

1. <u>First Aid and CPR</u> –Our next class will be January 27. FREE TO VOLUNTEERS, MUCH OF IT ONLINE, AND REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION, AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. Remember, YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE.

- 1. Certification sail on Aleta will be December 17.
- 2. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> has a <u>night overboard practice</u> certification sail set for 2/16. Only sign up if you have completed a day overboard practice already.
- 3. Golden Bear certification sail will be set up soon...check the website.
- 4. And recall if come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list.

<u>GOLDEN BEAR:</u> We finally received reimbursement from St Francis' collision with a berthed Bear and will now plan on work on Bear to get hull and deck repaired. Captain Andrew has received a bid for the deck work, bottom job and the like and it looks like the Bear will be at the yard for perhaps a month during the school out hiatus in

December...Aleta will take on any sails that are needed in the City.

OCEAN VOYAGES TRAINING

Recall that Lee and other captains will be continuing offshore training in Benjamin Walters, in late Spring probably...

INSURANCE AND MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE:

Insurance remains in place but there will be a board meeting to discuss cost benefit of the various policies we now own...at 16,000 a year, and never a single claim in 33 years, there is a suggestion we consider alternatives. Stay tuned.

MONEY: \$20,867 in the bank. And most of that will go for Golden Bear repairs and improvements. *Boats eat money. No payroll costs...all volunteer...but boats cost...*

PRESIDENT'S PARTY:

Our president is arranging a cocktail fund-raising party at the Elks Club in San Francisco, 7-9 on a Saturday evening, February 3, in the City, 75.00 entry and ideally a way to raise some money for boat maintenance with fun...Think about attending...how else can you help our programs and socialize at the same time?! Kimberly, Judy and Shannon are on the committee making this happen and are looking for some help...

We also hope to raise some money on Giving Tuesday which is coming up. A grant from Sares Regis Foundation is now submitted.

STANDARD OF CONDUCT ON BOARD PROTOCOLS:

A proposed set of protocols for conduct on board is now being circulated among the executive board and captains for proposal to the board at the next board meeting. Stay tuned.

<u>DONATIONS IN KIND</u>: We have received donations in kind...ranging from sailing gear to lessons at Modern Sailing...and we have to develop a method to determine how and when to distribute same and establish a committee to do that. Protocols on distribution of donations in kind are now being distributed to be voted on at the next board meeting.

In that regard, a Taswell 49 may be offered to Blue Water and the board and captains are considering if the vessel can be used and maintained as required...more in the next month's minutes.

Internships give these students both experience and the beginning of a resume' that can open worlds for them. Meanwhile Jim has begun the search for the next Italian music scholarship and is interviewing various music schools in the Bay Area. The last very successful trip to Italy by Isaac has convinced Jim (and Sategna) that this is a great program.
