SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

While it will be Fall before the usual sails can begin again, over the summer the District is having school for fifth and sixth graders and they have asked us to take them sailing. We will be setting that up over the next few months.

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails ARE beginning again.

- 1. Our students from Silver Springs School in Grass Valley will be sailing in May 20 (a Thursday)
- 2. We have two Weekend Adventure sails (kids from the Tenderloin, middle school age) <u>July 10</u> and July 17.
- 3. Two Greenager sails scheduled, one for August 7, one for August 21.

4. We will be setting up sails with the <u>South Beach Sailing Club summer camp</u> in the next several weeks.

All these should be on Golden Bear leaving from SF...check the website for details.

PROBATION DEPARTMENT SAILS:

ALAMEDA COUNTY JUVENILE PROBATION BEGINS AGAIN on Friday afternoons and evenings aside from the graduation ceremony on a Sunday. They are 5/21;6/4; Night sail for 5/7; 6/18; 7/9 and the graduation sail on 8/21. Mentor mentee method, same students, and those who graduate show their families what they have learned and receive a certificate.

<u>EI DORADO PROBATION</u> is setting their own schedule to bring their students down for sails. Stay tuned for the actual dates. This will likely begin in June.

CONTRA COSTA is checking their own schedule and indicates a tentative start date in July.

SF COUNTY has contacted us to begin the process of setting up a new class but due to their own changes, likely not until July or August. We just had a zoom call with them and will be taking the new POs in their system sailing to show them what the experience is like. Stay tuned for details.

<u>MARIN JUVENILE PROBATION</u> has also contacted Blue Water and we plan to begin sails with them once the pandemic recedes.



Training & Certification

Our full day training and certification sails speed up the certification process. We have developed pandemic safe protocol for the training. We are also scheduling more CPR-First Aid Red Cross certified training since that is also a prerequisite to full certification.

GOLDEN BEAR: At a cost of over five thousand dollars, the pulpits are now refabricated and are being installed this weekend. Colm is working on replacing the forward hatch which still leaks a bit. The reefing winch has been rebuilt. And soon we will have a discussion as to putting some type of head on board.

ALETA: Steaming light being repaired, and high-water alarm installed. Rest of work now done.

<u>BENJAMIN WALTERS</u>: Has passed all surveys. Putting in new decking just forward of dodger, new lifelines on the boat in the next six months at owner expense and deck leaks at shrouds that bring in water when the gunnels are

under water will be handled this month. All at owner expense. Ready to rock and roll and is already doing student sails

BRIGATINE MATHEW TURNER CONNECTION GASLIGHT CONNECTION

Both the Mathew Turner and Bay Lights Charters are up and running again and have contacted us for working together on sails. As the schools and probation departments open up, we will work to arrange voyages on those two great vessels. Further, the SF Police Wilderness Foundation may also arrange police-student sails. INSURANCE SEARCH:

Recall that our prior insurance carrier is withdrawing from the California marketplace. We are searching for a replacement carrier and now have Benjamin Walters fully insured after two surveys and a rigging survey. Golden Bear and Aleta are still seeking insurance but it will be expensive since they used to be racing boats which makes insurance companies needlessly nervous. Stay tuned. Our single largest expense is becoming...insurance...despite not a single claim for three decades!!

An insurance search committee for next year has been created so that we can avoid the massive cost we are facing this year. JOANNE, STEVE K AND LEE will be on it and invite any others interested in joining. We will have our first conference in the next month.

MONEY: \$18,637 in the bank. We hope to receive \$5000 again from the Mary Norris Foundation. We received 1000 from Bill Mania's company and gave them a thank you sail. Marty has filed our tax returns for the year...

Remember, we need about \$30,000 a year for good maintenance alone, not including the large projects on the boat... And insurance costs about two thirds of that more...Boats eat money. OUR MONEY GOES TO PROGRAMS AND THE BOATS. NO PAYROLL, NO BIG OVERHEAD.
